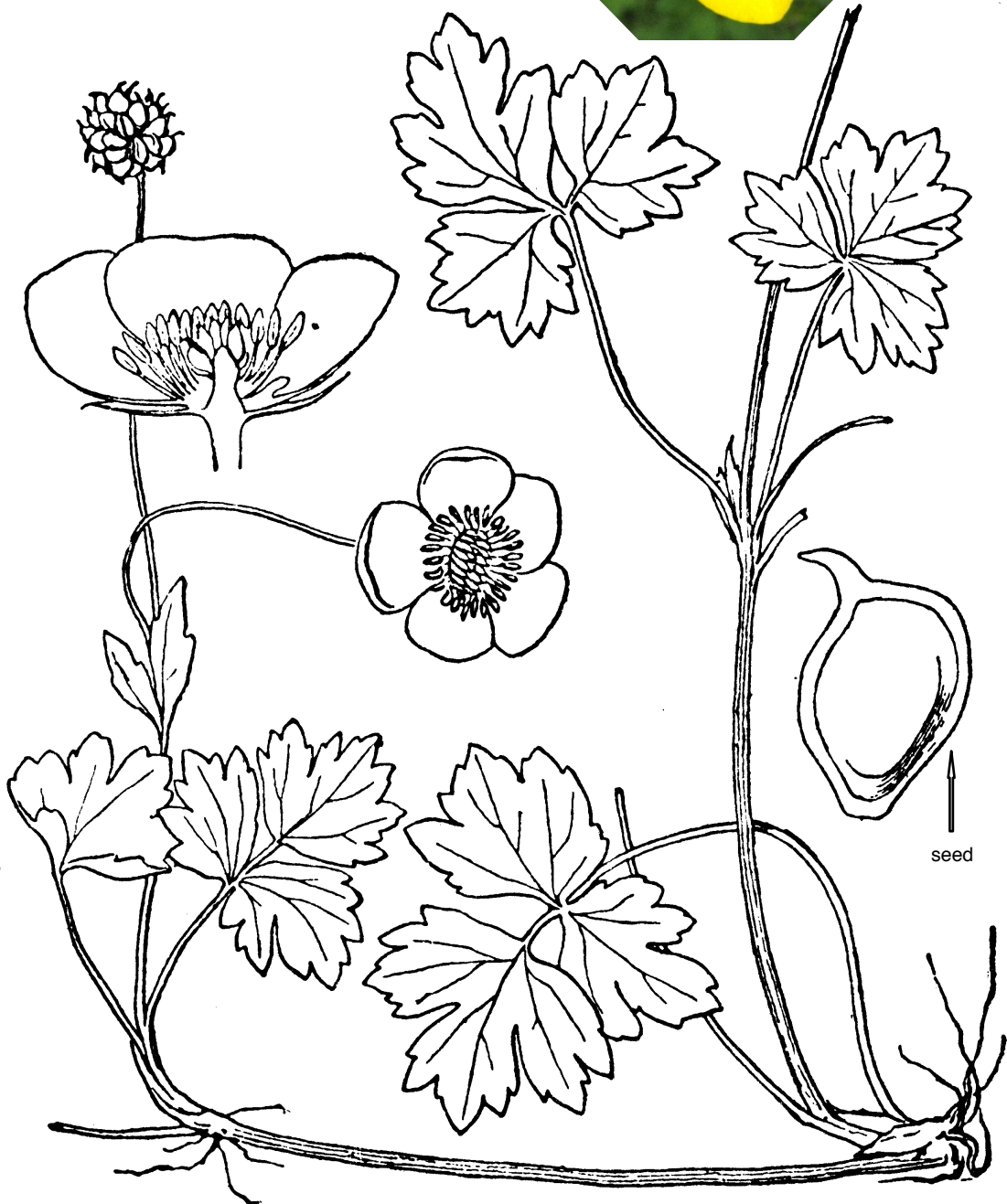
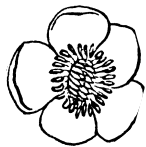
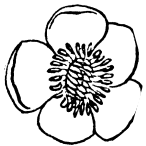
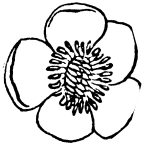
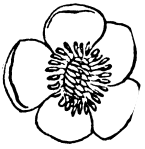
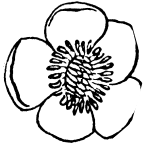


Creeping buttercup

Native to Europe, Asia, and Africa it was introduced and is considered invasive in North America. Buttercups flower from May to August growing in grasslands, damp places, along roadsides, field edges and in parks and gardens. This golden-cupped flower can return us to our childhood: if a yellow reflection appears when held up to the chin, it is considered as a sign that the person likes butter. Yellow dye made from the flowers is used in the crafting of baskets and rugs. All parts of a buttercup are poisonous when eaten by cattle and humans.
