Daisy is native to Europe and temperate Asia. It has been introduced to Canada and is considered invasive in much of North America. It blooms from June to September in meadows and fields, under scrub and open-canopy forests, and in disturbed areas. The yellow centre of the oxeye daisy is made up of many small flowers which hold nectar, and are exploited by various pollinating insects, including butterflies, bees, hoverflies and small beetles.
